What does the training include?

This programme follows the Department for Education's NPQ for SENCOs framework [National professional qualification for special educational needs co-ordinators \(publishing.service.gov.uk\)](https://www.gov.uk/guidance/national-professional-qualification-for-special-educational-needs-co-ordinators)

You will learn how to

- > Contribute to establishing and sustaining a positive and supportive culture across the school for all pupils.
- > Support senior leaders to ensure staff and governors enact statutory guidance.
- > Support teachers and support staff to understand the importance of expert teaching for all pupils and to implement a graduated approach in the classroom, subject or domain effectively.
- > Support the delivery of effective provision for pupils with SEND and their families, and be able to review, monitor, evaluate and improve the impact of SEND provision.
- > Work with staff, specialists and other agencies to assist the school in meeting the needs of all pupils.
- > Implement an efficient SEND identification process which ensures that barriers to learning are identified and addressed at the earliest opportunity.

How is the training delivered?

The programme is made up of nine courses, each lasting six weeks. Each course is taught through a combination of independent self-study modules, a facilitated live clinic, and a peer-led community session. The programme starts with a one-day live conference.

How much does the training cost?

Department for Education-funded scholarships are available for publicly funded-schools and academies in England. Contact us to find out if you're eligible.

If your setting isn't eligible, the NPQ for SENCOs costs £1,332 + VAT.
